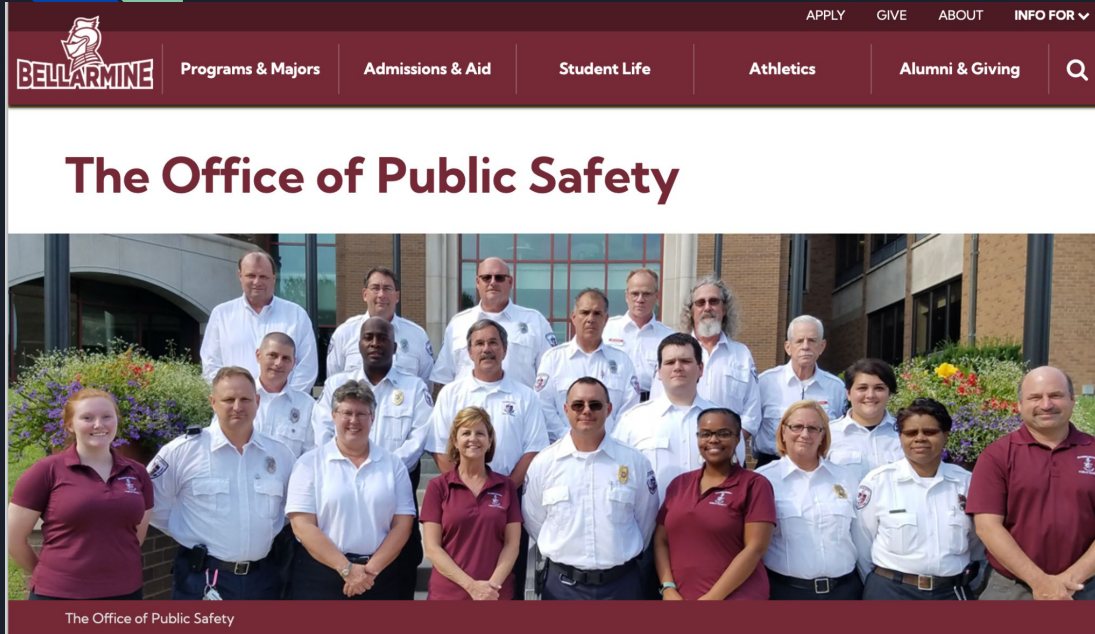

Beneficial Add ons

1. A very useful incorporation that was seen on San Jose State University's campus website was a **Discrimination and Harrasment Complaints** section.
 - a. Pros: This allows students to know that the University is committed creating an environment where students feel comfortable; easier way to keep up with the amount of complaints
2. Ursinus University introduced the idea of a **Diversity Action Team**. Although a formal description is not found for this team, it seems to me that it is an accountability group, full of staff and faculty members, for campus safety. I am unsure if this is the accurate description of them but having an accountability group would be beneficial.
3. Many of the universities that have been researched thus far provide students with mental health, physical health, self-care and more resources links.



What NOT to do



- Create a website that has **no links** to more resources (ex: Canisius College)
- Over commit to aesthetics and lose sight of valuable information; words mean nothing if there aren't **resources** to back them
- Have double or triple links, information should be **one** click away at most
